These coaching activities will take place in the local community and, working with Glasgow Life and the local police, will be supported by a series of workshops addressing issues of drugs/alcohol misuse, gang culture and pursuing a healthy lifestyle. The aim of the project is to engage young people in positive structured team activity whilst educating and informing them of the dangers of gang culture and the positive effects of leading a healthy safe lifestyle.

"This is what we're about," says Linda Lawson,

Bill's daughter and one of the Directors of the Foundation. "We've all been looking forward to the time when we were able to give to causes we believe in. It's a pleasure to be able to support ambitious clubs like Duns and Glasgow Hawks and to bring rugby into lives of children. The Foundation wish them well in their future and everything they're trying to achieve."

Connor is receiving funding towards the SRU's Community Rugby Coach Programme Year 2 where he will plan, co-ordinate and manage local rugby




